ANNUAL TOWN MEETING SCHEDULED FOR WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 27, AT 7 P.M.

major component of the governing of the City occurs each year when City Council hosts the annual Town Meeting. This year the event takes on special significance as a result of the effort of the Nation to claw its way back from one of the most severe recessions in many decades. One would be less than candid to attempt to ignore the negative impacts of the current depressed economy on this City and its citizens. At the annual Town Meeting this year, that will be major topics one of the under discussion. In spite of this severe downturn, there will be discussion of the achievements of the City during maintaining 2009 including enhancing services and goals for 2010.

This year's meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, January 27, 2010, at 7 p.m., in the Civic Center at 1415 Constitution Avenue.

As is the tradition, Mayor Leonard Scarcella will deliver the State of the City Message at the beginning of the meeting. This will be followed by reports from the Department Heads on the activities, services and conditions of the City. After the reports, there will be the opportunity for comments and questions from the general public pertaining to the following topics:

- (a) City's economy, zero property tax, sales and other taxes, and fiscal condition.
- (b) Zoning, enhanced building standards and new regulations, and landscaping for the US 90A and FM 1092 corridors.
- (c) Police and fire protection, emergency management

- endeavors, homeland security, and gang violence.
- (d) Stafford Centre and Stafford Civic Center.
- (e) Stafford Municipal School District, Houston Community College, and educational opportunities.
- (f) Stafford/Staffordshire Roads, Dulles Avenue and Brand Lane improvements, highways, streets, mobility, drainage, and water.
- (g) Parks.
- (h) Municipal Court.
- (i) Stafford Municipal Educational Television Station.
- (j) Other matters of interest affecting the City.

You are encouraged to attend and participate in this event and share your suggestions, comments, and questions.

If you cannot attend, the meeting will be televised live on S-METV, Channel 16 Comcast. There will be numerous rebroadcasts over the days to follow.

STAFFORD FD MAINTAINS HIGHEST NATIONAL RANKING

One item to be discussed at the Town Meeting will be the Stafford Fire Department's superior performance. The SFD has achieved an ISO Rating of One - the top rating a fire department can obtain. Less than 100 fire departments, out of 47,000 in the Nation, have this rating. This affords Staffordians top quality firefighter protection and results in lower insurance rates on homes and businesses.

IN FIRST 6 YEARS, STAFFORD CENTRE BRINGS IN MORE THAN A MILLION VISITORS

With the grand opening of the Stafford Centre on March 4-5, 2004, there was optimism and trepidation for the success of this 90,000 square foot facility containing a unique 1,100 seat performing arts theatre and 25,000 square feet of meeting, banquet and exposition space including a 20,000 square foot ballroom and over 28 acres of outdoor festival green space at the corner of Cash and Murphy Roads.



Some wondered whether anyone would come. But, after nearly six years and more than 1,200,000 visitors, little question remains that this is the most impressive facility in Fort Bend County and was designated "a signature image from Fort Bend".

Theatrical events have ranged from ballet to theatrical productions, symphonies and a host of headliner concerts. Couple that in the Convention Centre with weddings, festivals and other activities including corporate meetings, conventions, exhibitions and even boxing matches.

A key aspect of the Centre's success is versatility as has been demonstrated by the many outstanding and diverse functions. Its convenient location and easy access, plentiful ground-level parking, ticketing system and reasonable ticket prices, excellent viewing, and technologically advanced sound system and lighting in the Theatre add to its popularity.

The Stafford Economic Development Corporation which originally funded \$20 million of the \$29 million cost for this venue has provided funds to maintain and enhance the condition of the facility.

Much credit must go to FMsquared and its staff under the excellent leadership of its president, Bryan Blaum, who has negotiated most of the stellar events that have graced the Centre, and to Susan Ricks, Centre Administrator.



With six years under its belt, there remain even greater expectations for the future.

Many sterling events have been held at the Stafford Centre since its opening in 2004. Some of the most notable are:


- The Moscow Ballet productions

Joint Election with SMSD for Three Trustee Positions


CITY COUNCIL ELECTION SET FOR MAY 8

The annual City officers' election on May 8 will provide for the election of three Council member positions currently held by Ken Mathew, Robert Sorbet and Cecil Willis. Candidates will be seeking a two-year term. Various important dates in the election are set forth below.

Period for filing for application for place on the ballot: <u>February 6 – March 8</u>.

Period for filing declaration of write-in candidacy: <u>February 6 – March 15</u>.

First day to accept applications for voting by mail ballot: March 9.

Last day for submitting voter registration application in time to vote in the election: April 8.

Early voting in person <u>AT BOTH CITY</u> HALL AND SMSD ADMINISTRATION <u>BUILDING</u>: April 26 – May 4.

Last day to receive application by mail for a ballot to be voted by mail: <u>April 30</u>.

ELECTION DAY: May 8 AT CITY HALL ONLY – 7:00 A.M. TO 7:00 P.M.

This election will be held in conjunction with SMSD for three Trustee positions currently held by Greg Holsapple, Michael Cropper and ShaMekka Pratt-Simmons. Election to the Board will be for a three-year term.

Applications for City Council positions can be obtained at City Hall and those for school Board positions at the SMSD Administration Building.

March 2010 - Census forms are mailed or delivered to households.

April 1, 2010 - National Census Day—use this day as a point of reference for sending

your completed forms back in the mail.

April - July 2010 - Census takers visit households that did not return a form by mail.
